

HISTORY

MARKS Medical College (MRMC) is considered as one of the best private medical colleges in Bangladesh. It was established in 2011 by Late Brig. General Prof. M. R. Khan an eminent ENT-Head & Neck Surgeon of the country and the founder member, whose vision for providing quality medical education, research and health care service to people of this country at reasonable cost.

The objectives of the Institute are

- To promote and provide studies in medical science leading to recognized graduate and postgraduate degrees.
- To conduct research work on the diseases prevalent in the country.
- To conduct research on medical education with the aim of raising the standard of medical education in the country.
- To provide skilled manpower in the medical field.
- To provide quality medical care and health services to people at reasonable cost

The idea of establishment of a medical college was imparting quality medical education leading to recognized medical degree, was taken as the first and foremost aim of the Institute. Through the tireless efforts of the Founder Member the dream has been realized against much odds when permission was granted by the Government of Bangladesh for establishment of the college on 2011.

MARKS Medical College started its functioning from 2011 and The Dhaka University granted affiliation to the College on 2011. Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council the highest regulatory body of Medical graduates has recognized the College. The college has a new 9 storied academic building with spacious accommodation for all the departments and adequate parking facility.

The attached Hospital is a tertiary care referral medical facility and provides excellent training to students and junior doctors. The Hospital has arrangements for 350 inpatients. It is well equipped and provides quality health care to the public at reasonable cost. The entire hospital staff is dedicated to excellence and service.



Background Information:

Bangladesh is a small country consisting of an area of 1,44,000 sq. kilometer and having a population of about Sixteen core is one of the under developed countries of the world. Eighty five percent of the population live in the most remote villages of which 50% people are under poverty level and cannot gain access to proper medical treatment facility due to lack of skilled medical professionals. Increased morbidity and mortality due to lack of skilled medical professional is one of the reasons besides poverty, Ignorance, hunger and malnutrition in Bangladesh. Moreover thousands of mothers and children are the victim of premature death due to lack of proper health care.

Introduction:

MARKS Medical College and Hospital is a private teaching cum healthcare delivery organization. Establishment of such an institution assists mobilization of resources for health care & manpower development, solving national problems through basic and applied research and by encouraging self reliance in mass population.

The major Area of the College Activity:



ADMISSION

Admission Criteria

Candidates selected by the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) through a competitive examination, will be eligible for admission in Marks Medical College. Admission will be conducted on first come, first serve basis; while chronology of merit will be strictly followed. Candidates will have to undergo a medical test to prove their physical competency. Students who have passed SSC and HSC or equivalent, having at least GPA 4 individually and combined GPA-9 can apply for admission in MBBS course. Students who have passed HSC or equivalent examination two years before commencing of the session are not eligible to apply. Student with GCE O & A Level or 12th grade should have equivalent certificate from Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) Mohakhali, Dhaka.

Prescribed admission form and prospectus will be available from the office of the Principal on payment of Tk. 1,000/- (One Thousand) only.

Admission procedure for Foreign students

A charge of US \$ 30 is applicable for the foreign students for prospectus and application form. For the foreign students information regarding admission fee, tuition fee, rules & regulations etc. are available in the college website: marksgroupbd.com or calling the Principal/College Secretary directly at +88-02-8033373, 9003475, 9834031, 9834034.

Selection Procedure

An Admission Committee on the basis of "admission test examination results" makes selection of the students. The admission Committee selects students purely on merit basis as per guidelines given by the office of the Director General of Health Services. Students should be medically fit.

Course and Curriculum

Course offered (MBBS) is of 5-years duration. One year internship is required for certification. The curriculum approved the University of Dhaka and BM&DC is strictly followed in the college.

MBBS Course

Pre-clinical subjects: Anatomy, Physiology and Bio-chemistry
Para-clinical subjects: Community Medicine, Forensic Medicine, Pharmacology, Pathology & Microbiology
Clinical subject: Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Medicine, Surgery and their allied subjects.

Teaching Aids

Overhead projector, Epidiascope, Multimedia projector and other audiovisual equipments, DVD are used to make assimilation easy. CME based programme, Seminars and symposiums are organized on regular basis to acquaint the students with the latest development in medical science. A student can get access to information highway through the internet facilities of the college. The departments extensively utilize the facilities for making instruction more useful and effective. The teachers make learning easy for the students with the help of audio-visual equipment and multimedia setup.

Foundation Courses

Foundation Courses on English Language and computer of three months duration are mandatory for all students and a privilege charge will have to be paid which is subject to change at any time of the academic year. The medium of instruction is English.

Teaching Methodology

The students are generally taught by lectures, clinical demonstrations, tutorials and practical ward demonstration, seminars, symposiums, workshops, field visits and residential field site training, demonstration and autopsy, as per University, BM&DC & Govt. criteria. Academic progress reports of students are sent to their guardians from time to time and kept informed about their academic and extracurricular activities.

Library

Library is located in the College Building and has a collection of sufficient number of text and reference books, monographs and journals in various subjects and providers update information to students and teachers. It has user-friendly open stack easy access system. The Library has reading room, which can accommodate about 100 students at a time and also a separate teacher's reading room.

Library remains open from 8 am to 5 pm. The librarian is well-experienced with degree in library science who is assisted by assistant librarians. The library subscribes 2 indexed journals. We are in the process of developing a modem library with sufficient computers for teachers and students. They will have online access to Internet.

Internship Training

The student successfully passing final MBBS examination will have to undergo one year internship training in the college hospital (MMCH). During internship training subsistence allowance are given to the interns.

College Examination and Evaluation

The teachers of individual departments regularly assess student's learning through cards containing items of concerned subject. Card Final and Assessment Examination are regularly held at different levels throughout the year. Students will have to secure 60% marks to pass any level of examination. College authority conducts an annual examination for the students at the year end. To get promotion to the next higher level, eligibility for appearing in the professional examination needs 60% marks in the periodical examinations with at least 80% of class attendance. This institute is committed to produce quality doctors by maintaining the academic standard strictly.

COLLEGE

Instructions For The Students

- Students have to carry their "IDENTITY CARDS" when in the college campus.
- Wearing of apron mandatory while inside college campus.
- Students are expected to attend classes in clear & well dressed clothes and shoes for boys.
- Fashionable dress, cosmetics, untidy hair, slippers are discouraged in the college campus.
- · Rings, bangles are impediment in the practical classes.
- Smoking is forbidden in the college campus.
- · Environment should be kept clean.
- Pasting of posters on the walls of the college and the hospital premises are prohibited. These are considered as acts of indiscipline and the offend those who involved are liable to punishment.
- Closing of college, hospital, and department gates or doors and creating obstacles in the normal functioning are act of gross indiscipline and students in volvedin such acts are liable to be expelled from college.
- All types of demonstrations, processions, shouting in the college and hospital premises are prohibited and students involved in them are liable to be expelled from college.
- Abstentions from classes individually or in a mass without prior permission and without valid reasons are punishable by imposition of daily fine of Tk.500/individually.
- Guardians must maintain contact with respective Phase Coordinators to ensure that their son/daugh ter is attending classes regularly and performing satisfactorily.
- There are counseling bodies in each phase headed by the Head of the department. So that students can state their problems/inconveniences to the Counseling Body. The Counseling Body will solve the problem or refer it to the Principal if necessary. Statement of the grievances/ problems/ inconveniences by the students must be in an orderly and disciplined manner. Any act of indiscipline on the part of any student including usage of abusive words or objectionable words and sentences will make the student liable to be punished by expulsion from the college.

- Students must not misbehave with the staff or employees of the college. Misbehavior is an act of indiscipline and liable to punishment.
- The students are expected to maintain the high est standard in their academic and private lives.
 Loss of moral and spiritual values or addiction to alcohol and narcotic drugs are punishable.
- At the time of admission into the college, students and parents/guardians will have to sign a bond that their children/ward will abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
- Every student shall provide for himself/herself all the proscribed text books, dissecting instruments, and medical equipment. The college will not supply these to the students.
- Leave: in case of illness or other unavoidable reasons of non-attendance student should submit application to the principal forwarded by departmental Head or a written application from the parent/guardian should be submitted to the principal through respective departmental head, if there is delay/problem in submission of application respective departmental head should be informed over mobile phone at earliest possible.
- Receiving private coaching from any teacher of MRMC is prohibited. If any student or his/her guardian seeks private coaching from any teach er of this institution disciplinary action will be taken as per rules of Dhaka University.
- Cost of loss/damage to college/hospital property by student will be borne by concern student.
- Political activities are not permitted in the college.



College Administration

Principal is the Executive Head. On academic matters, he is advised by the Academic Council.

College Finance

The college is run on self-financing and non-profit basis.

Staff Selection Procedure

Teachers and staff are selected through Staff Selection Committees. Teachers have to posses qualifications as per requirements of Bangladesh Medical College and Dental Council.

Students Participation

Students are encouraged to participate in extra-curricular activities such as:

Sports games, cultural activities, debating competition, wall magazine etc.

Common room activities

Literary activities such as debates, seminars, publications of Annual Magazine.

Social activities

Humanitarian services such as free blood donation and free medicine supply for poor patients, relief works during natural calamities such as cyclones, floods, epidemics etc.

Committees consisting of Teachers and Students (Teachers-Students Committees) look after these activates.

Study Tour

There is a provision for study tour in the new curriculum. The students will have to bear cost of study tour in addition to the regular tuition fees and fees at the time of admission.

Guardians Participation

Guardians Advice on the College affairs is welcome. Two quardians are members of the MRMC Governing Body.

Academic Council

Academic Council meets in every six months and whenever necessary. They discuss all aspects of academic activities and discipline of students. Academic Council is also responsible for coordination of courses and quality control of education through Academic Coordinator and Phase Coordinators.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Students Teaching

Student teaching is guided by Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors in lecture classes and also in the wards during clinical classes. Students are placed in small groups, small group teaching and proper feedback from students are ensured through lecturers, registrars and assistant registrars. Students teaching in the morning is primarily done by Faculty Members. Registrars teach students in the evening session. Students are required to complete their cards and other assessment criteria before being allowed to take the MBBS final professional examinations.

Journal Club

Journal Club Meetings is held in clinical departments once weekly and are attended by all members of the Department. Papers are read by the members of the Faculty, interns and junior doctors take part and important journals are regularly covered. Two journals of MARKS Medical College is published yearly since 2013 which has BM&DC recognition.

Seminars

Seminars and Clinical Meetings are held on a regular basis. Presentations are made by distinguished speakers from our College and also from other medical institutions in Bangladesh and outside the country.

Morning Session

Daily discussion meetings are held every morning in clinical departments with Interns, Assistant Registrars and Faculty Members. Interesting cases that were admitted the previous day are presented in detail by the Interns and the Assistant Registrars along with the Consultant on call for the day. Symptoms, physical signs, diagnosis, investigations like X-rays, ECG and laboratory tests are discussed in detail along with management plans. The Morning Session is well attended and is an excellent teaching and learning session for all.

FACILITIES FOR TRAINING

All departments have well qualified members in their teaching staff, trained in Bangladesh, United Kingdom, United States and other countries. The management and the teaching staff are highly motivated and sincerely interested in optimal patient care, and in the teaching of medical students and junior doctors. Excellent and intensive supervision is provided to them.

Inpatients

This consists of non paying male and female beds, paying beds, and cabins for patients to be admitted. The College and Hospital have a well organized system of interns, Assistant Registrars and Registrars in training positions. Admission of patients cover a wide range of pathology giving excellent exposure for training of students. All admissions are covered by Associate Professors and above. Morning and evening rounds, as well as weekend rounds are conducted by them on a regular basis. In addition, they come to the Hospital when they are called even during odd hours. Patient care is supported by adequate radiology and pathology services for instigations.

Intensive Care Unit/Coronary Care Unit/ Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

The intensive Care Unit has 8 bed and critically ill patients are routinely admitted with a high percentage of bed occupancy. The ICU and the NICU often receive referrals from other institutions in Bangladesh. They are well equipped with ventilators, cardiac monitors, CVP lines and monitoring, pulse oximeter, and are staffed by physicians 24 hours a day throughout the year. Neonatal intensive Care Unit has 4 incubators and ventilator for the management of critically ill newborns.

Outpatients

The Hospital has a busy Outpatient Department. Patients may obtain consultation at a minimal charge. There is also a fast track system through which patients may be seen by a consultant on call, immediately, on payment of a higher charge.

Emergency

The Hospital has a fully functioning Emergency Department that provides coverage during the evening, night and during holidays. It has its own set of doctors who are free to seek help from other services.



Name of the Course:

Bachelor of Medicine & Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS)

Basic qualifications & prerequisite for entrance in MBBS Course:

• HSC or equivalent with Science (Biology), Physics, Chemistry)

Candidate has to secure required grade point in the SSC and HSC examinations.

Students selection procedure for MBBS course: According to merit as per national policy guidelines. Medium of

Instruction: English

Duration: MBBS course comprises of 5 years followed by logbook based rotatory internship for one year.

Course structure and duration

The MBBS course is divided into four phases.

NB: All academic activities including professional examination of each phase must be completed within the specified time of the phase.

The student successfully passing final MBBS examination will have to undergo one year internship training in the college hospital (MMCH). During internship training subsistence allowance are given to the interns.

NOTE

Anatomy includes General Anatomy, General Embroylogy, General histology, Head and Neck, CNS and eyeball, Systemic embryology of Head and Neck, NCS and Eyeball, Genetics, Superior and Inferior Extremities, Thorax and Abbomen, Systemic Embryology, Systemic Histology.

Physiology includes General Physical, Blood, Cardiovascular System, Respiratory System, Alimentary System, Endocrinology, reproduction System, Kidney and body fluids, Nervous System & body temperature, Special senses.

Biochemistry includes Elemintary Biochemistry and Bioloecules, Chemistry of Proximate Food Principles, Nutritional Biochemistry (Macrountrients, Vitamins, minarals), Digestion and Absorption, Metabolism (carbohydrate, protein and Fat Metabolism), Molecular Biology and Genetics, Clinical Biochemistry (important diseases related investigation, methods of analytes estimation), Clinical Endocrinology.

Community Medicine includes-concept of Community Medicine, Health & Disease, Primary Health Care, Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Research Methodology, Public health nutrition, Occupational health, Environmental health, Immunity, Behavioral Science etc.

Forensic Medicine includes Medical ethics, BMDC, rights & privileges of doctors, autopsy, consent, asphyxial death, DNA profiling, wounds, pregnancy & delivery, poisoning, end life care etc.

Pharmacology & Therapeutics includes General Pharmacology, Pharmacokinetics, Pharmacodynamics, Autonomic & CNS Pharmacology, Chemotherapy, Clinical pharmacology etc.

Pathology includes General Pahtology, Systemic Pathology, Haematopathology, Chemical and Clinical Pathology.

Microbiology includes Bacteriology, Immunology, Virology, Parasitology, Mycology and Clinical Pathology. Medicine includes Internal Medicine, Peadiarics, Psychiatry, Dermatology, Venereal Diseases and Physical Medicine.

Surgery includes General and Regional Surgery, Orthopaedics and Traumatology, Ophthalmology, Otorhinolaryngology, Anaesthesiology, Radiotherapy, Blood Transfusion and Dentistry. Obstetrics and Gynaecology includes also Neonatology and Family Planing.



Eligibility for appearing in the professional examination:

- Certificate from the respective head of departments regarding students obtaining at least 75% attendance in all classes (theory, practical, tutorial, esidential field practice, clinical placement etc.) during the phase.
- Obtaining at least 60% marks in examinations.
- No students shall be allowed to appear in the professional examinations unless the students passes in all the subjects of the previous professional examinations.

Pass Marks:

Pass marks is 60%. Student shall have to pass written (MCQ+SAQ+formative), oral, practical clinical examination separately.

Common Rules for Examination

- University professional to be started form May and November.
- University professional examinations will be completed within the specified time of the concerned phase.
- No carry on system before passing 1st professional examination.
- After passing 1st professional examination students can appear for 2nd professional examinations if all other prerequisites for 2nd professional examination are fulfilled. In the mean time students can attend clinical ward placement, teaching learning.
- To appear in 3rd professional examination students have to pass all the subjects of previous 2nd professional examination if all other prerequisites are fulfilled. In the mean time students can attend clinical ward placement, teaching learning. Students can also attend the classes of subjects of 4th phase.
- To appear in 4the (Final) professional examination students have to pass all the subjects of previous 3rd professional examination if all other prerequisites are fulfilled. In the mean time students can attend clinical ward placement, teaching learning.

NOTE-I

10% of written examination of each paper of each subject is allocated for formative assessment. 20% allocated for MCQ for each paper. Time allocation is 1 minute for each question consisting of 5 stems (20 questions).

NOTE-II

Honours (subject wise, securing 85% or more marks of the total in the subject) and merit positions are declared only in the cases of regular students. Irregular students have no claim over Honours declaration and Merit position declaration. Those students who pass their examinations in the scheduled time are considered as regular students.
